Requirements

For the SaferUp! Prize 2021 we would like you to explain your on-going project to a non-scientific audience. Imagine that you want to describe it to a friend or a relative. This presentation should show that you are able to communicate in a simple way about complex research activities.

To achieve your goal, you can use different techniques and methods: make a video, create a fun presentation, use PowerPoint in non-traditional ways (e.g. making a stop-motion-like presentation), draw an entertaining comic, build a model or whatever you decide to do. In short: be creative!

The following questions should be considered while preparing your presentation:

- What is your project about?
- What is your goal and why is this project important for our future?
- Can you present any tangible results so far?

Your presentation will be judged on the following criteria:

- Concreteness in describing the research, on-going activities and results
- Effectiveness in communicating the project to a different audience
- Creativity in the production of the presentation

Your presentation, if based on time, should not be longer than 2 minutes. If you choose to draw a comic, it should not be longer than a couple of pages.
